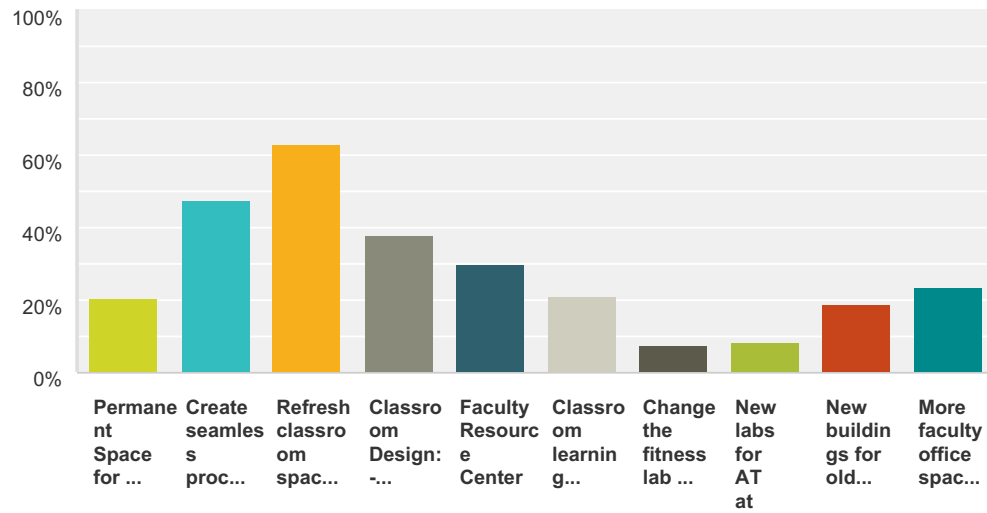


Q1 Facilities Choose the top three items that are most important to you.

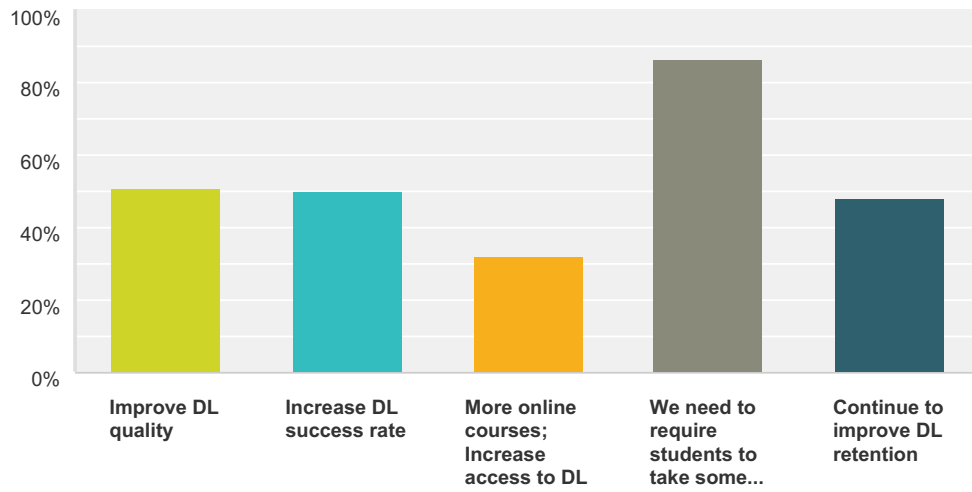

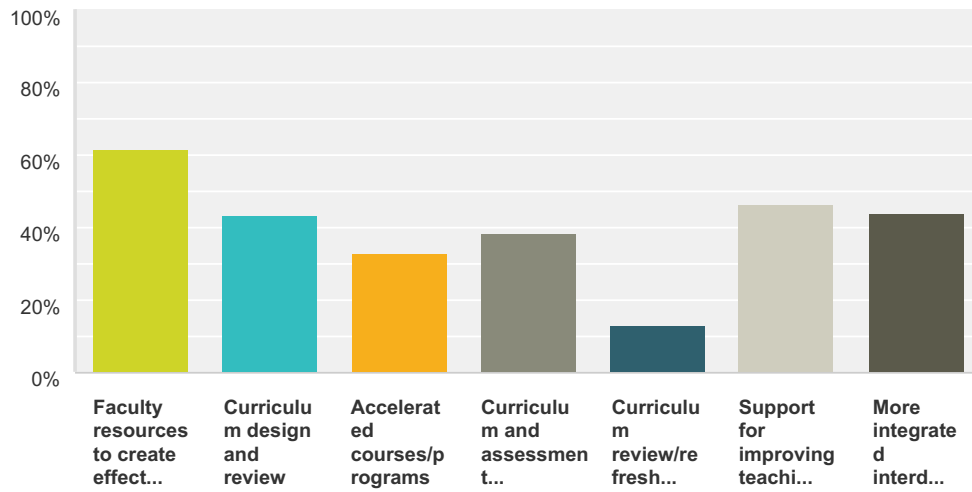

Q3 Curriculum Choose the top three items that are most important to you.

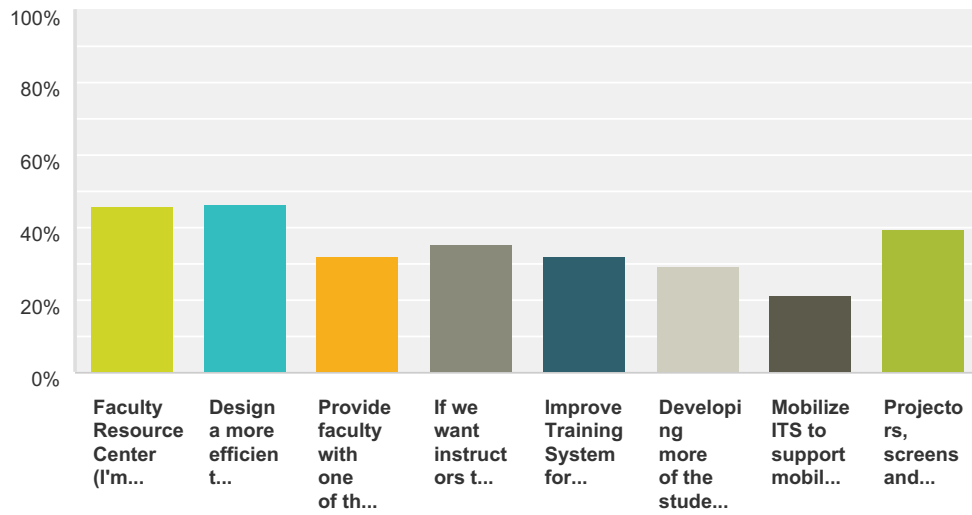

Q4 Technology Choose the top three items that are most important to you.

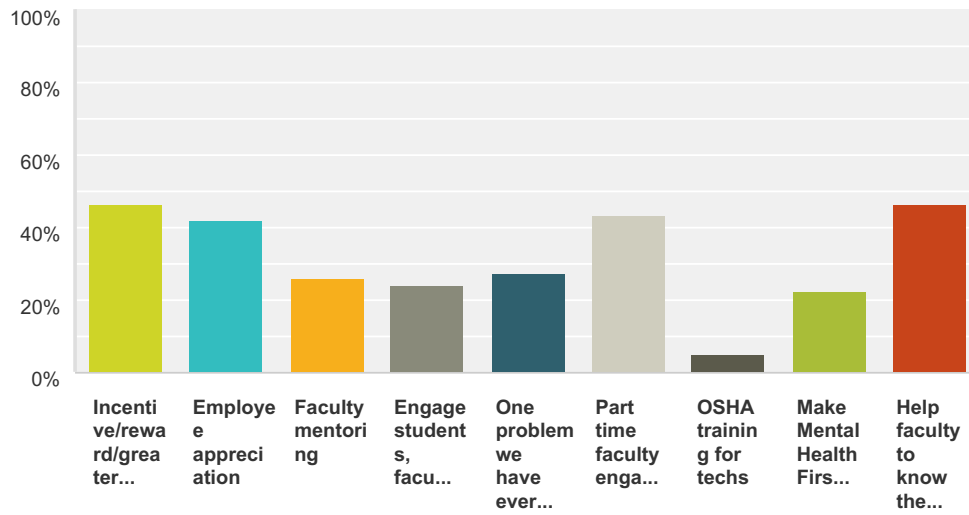

Design a more efficient training system to get many more instructors up to speed with new technology.	46.36% 153
Provide faculty with one of the two leading free cloud services, such as Dropbox and GoogleDrive. One of these two cloud services will make collaboration much easier and simpler among faculty, and between students and faculty (GoogleDrive especially). They will also allow instructors to access files from any computer or mobile device from anywhere in the world, making them much more mobile. Dropbox and GoogleDrive both have apps that integrate with many commonly used note taking, annotating, photo, and both audio and video creation apps (lecture capture), just to name a few. 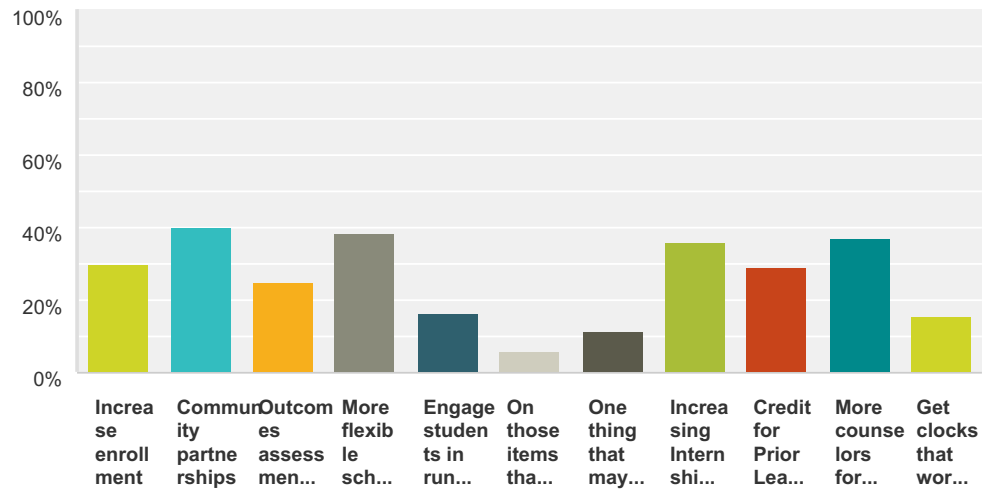
