

A minimum of 49 additional credit hours of required social work classes from NMHU School of Social Work and a minimum of 128 credit hours to earn the degree.

NMHU Requirements

- Courses not completed with a letter grade of C or better may not count toward completion of NMHU requirements.
- Students graduating from CNM with an Associate of Arts in Child, Youth, and Family Development with Social Work Concentration are waived from NMHU's Physical Education (2 credit hours) and English Literature (3 credit hours) and Language Other than English (8 credit hour) requirement.
- Students completing an Associate of Arts Degree in Child, Youth and Family Development with Social Work Concentration must apply for admission to NMHU to continue Bachelor of Social Work requirements.
- Students completing the Bachelor of Social Work must complete a minimum of 128 credit hours with a GPA of 2.0 or better in order to earn the degree. Students completing CNM's Associate Degree in CYFD with Social Work Concentration (with 64 credit hours) and 52 credit hours of required social work classes will need an additional 12 elective credit hours to complete the 128 credit hour minimum. Courses at either institution may fulfill this requirement but students should consult a NMHU advisor to select courses that best prepare them for the field of social work.
- Undergraduate social work students have the opportunity to apply to the graduate/Master of Social Work Advanced Standing Program at the end of their junior year. If admitted, student can enroll into one of the MSW concentrations upon completion of the BSW degree and can complete the MSW within two academic semesters.

This agreement will be reviewed by CNM and NMHU annually.
