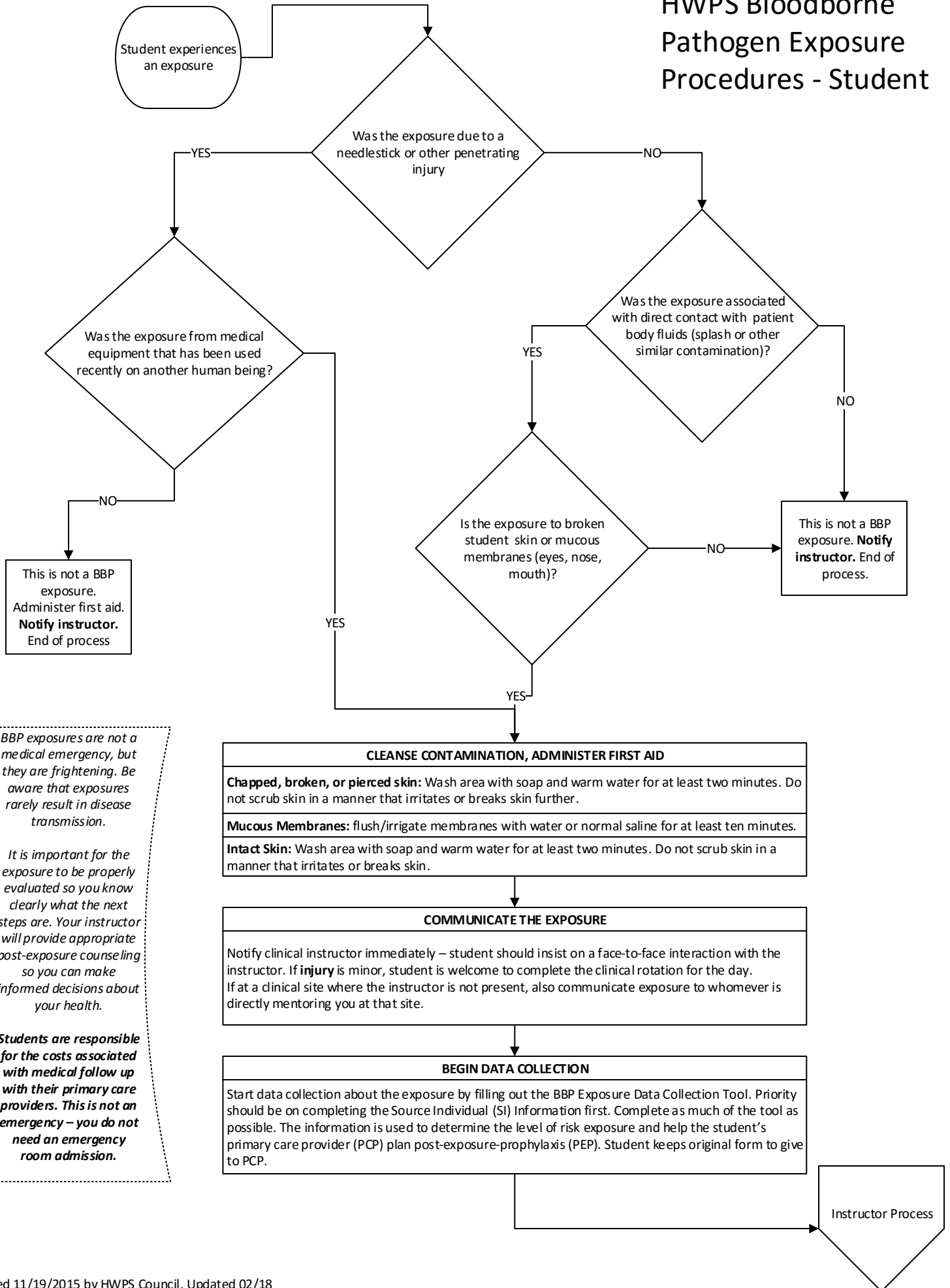


HWPS Bloodborne Pathogen Exposure Procedures - Student

BBP exposures are not a medical emergency, but they are frightening. Be aware that exposures rarely result in disease transmission.

It is important for the exposure to be properly evaluated so you know clearly what the next steps are. Your instructor will provide appropriate post-exposure counseling so you can make informed decisions about your health.

Students are responsible for the costs associated with medical follow up with their primary care providers. This is not an emergency – you do not need an emergency room admission.

CLEANSE CONTAMINATION, ADMINISTER FIRST AID

Chapped, broken, or pierced skin: Wash area with soap and warm water for at least two minutes. Do not scrub skin in a manner that irritates or breaks skin further.

Mucous Membranes: flush/irrigate membranes with water or normal saline for at least ten minutes.

Intact Skin: Wash area with soap and warm water for at least two minutes. Do not scrub skin in a manner that irritates or breaks skin.

COMMUNICATE THE EXPOSURE

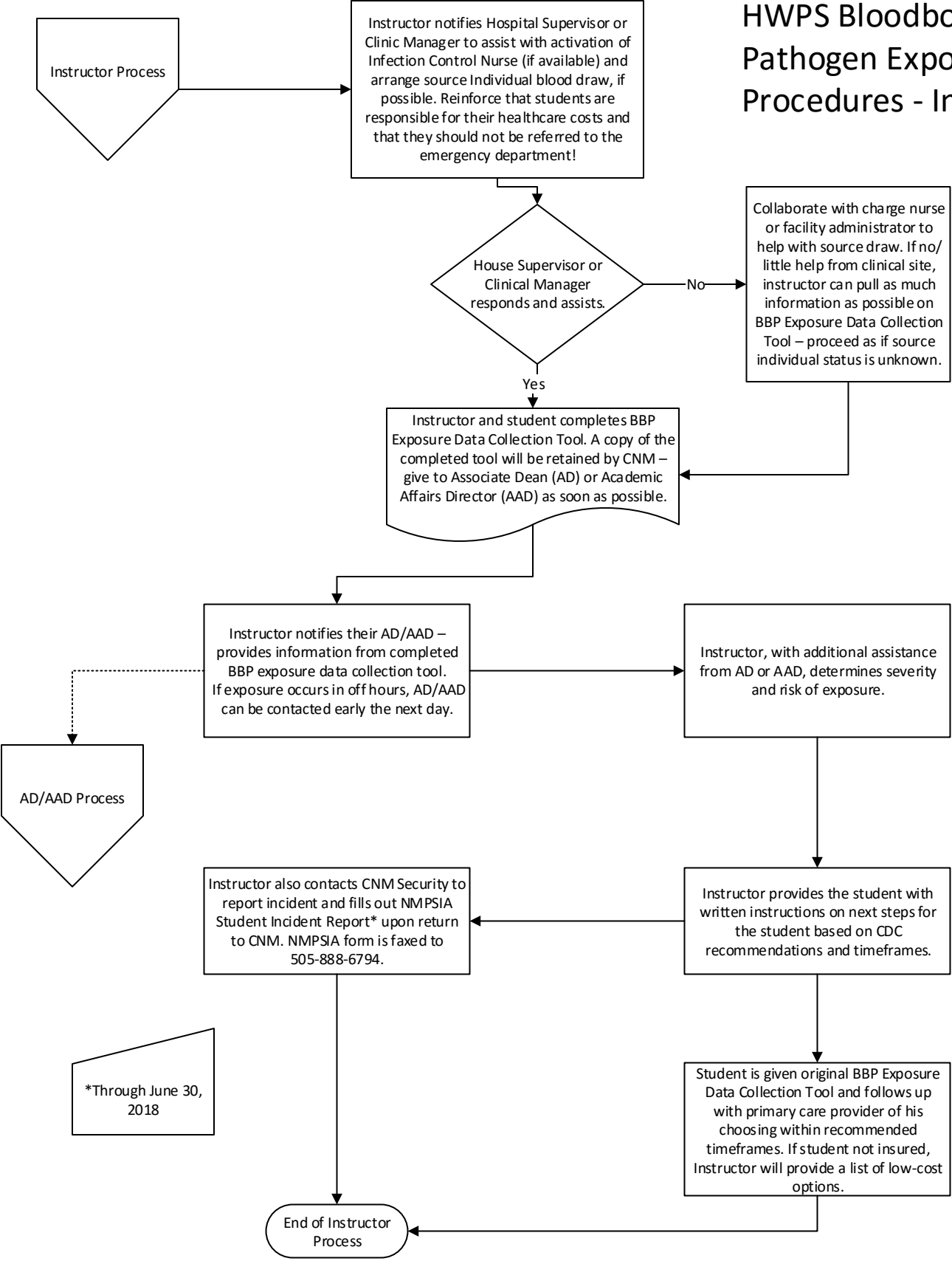
Notify clinical instructor immediately – student should insist on a face-to-face interaction with the instructor. If **injury** is minor, student is welcome to complete the clinical rotation for the day. If at a clinical site where the instructor is not present, also communicate exposure to whomever is directly mentoring you at that site.

BEGIN DATA COLLECTION

Start data collection about the exposure by filling out the BBP Exposure Data Collection Tool. Priority should be on completing the Source Individual (SI) Information first. Complete as much of the tool as possible. The information is used to determine the level of risk exposure and help the student's primary care provider (PCP) plan post-exposure-prophylaxis (PEP). Student keeps original form to give to PCP.
